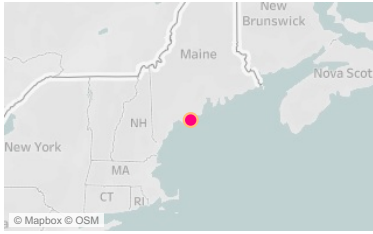

Performance Indicators

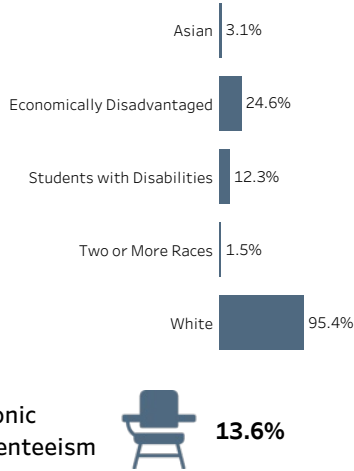

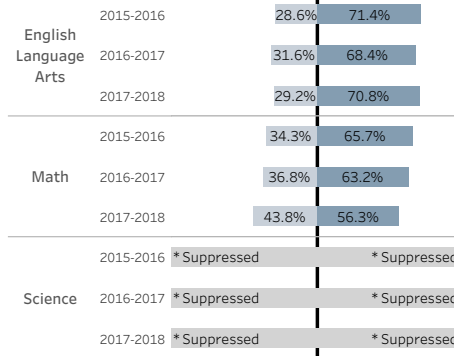

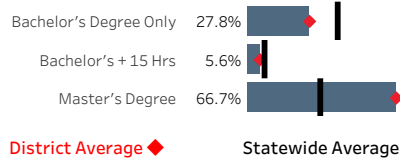


Academic Performance
